

# Standard Operating Procedures

(Formerly named Patron Requirements)

1. All shooters must check in at the range office and sign waiver.
2. First time user of the range must watch training video.
3. Park vehicles in areas designated by signs or a range officer.
4. All service animals must be on a leash or under complete control at all times. **No other pets.**
5. Children under 14 years of age must be with parent or guardian working one-on-one on the firing line. Children under 14 years old must be supervised at all times. Children 14 to 17 years old must be with an adult at least 21 years old.
6. Obey all range officer commands. Failure to obey range officer commands may lead to ban from future use of the facilities. Failure to obey range officers order to leave premises will result in prosecution.
7. Intentional property damage will result in prosecution.
8. Keep firearm actions open when not firing.
9. Point muzzle in safe direction at all times.
10. 50 Yard Range: No one allowed forward of the **RED** firing line on the 50 year range, if equipment is dropped or targets need to be repaired. Only a range safety officer will be allowed to go forward when range is cold.
11. 300 Yard Range: No one allowed forward of the **RED** firing line until range is cleared by range safety officer.
12. Clean up your brass after shooting. Place brass in blue barrels.
13. All brass that falls forward of the red line on the 50-yard range **CANNOT** be recovered for safety reasons.
14. Eye & Ear protection **MUST** be worn by everyone.
15. No smoking, food or drinks allowed in shooting range.
16. No armor piercing or tracer ammunition permitted. **(Range staff will check Ammunition; all decisions by staff are final.)**
17. Please place litter in trash receptacles.
18. Alcoholic beverages and all controlled substances are prohibited on the premises.
19. Speed drawing a firearm from a holster is prohibited, presentation draw will be allowed from hip holster. (No shoulder holsters/ No cross draw).
20. Shooters may only fire one round per second on the 50-yard range and one round per five seconds on the 300-yard range.
21. No fully automatic weapons allowed on either range.
22. Weber County and its representatives, or its employees are **NOT** responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged equipment or other articles.\

The above rules are general facility rules for the safety and enjoyment of user and visitors at the Weber County Sport Shooting Complex. Specific range rules may also apply and are enforced at all times by range staff and volunteers. Safe firearm handling must be used at all times.
